


























Unemployment Rates, New Jersey vs. United States: April 2016 - April 2017




New Jersey vs. United States, Labor Force Participation Rate: April 2016 - April 2017











New Jersey Counties Unemployment Rates - March 2017






New Jersey Counties Unemployed Residents - March 2017






New Jersey Counties Labor Force Per Square Mile - March 2017
